Great Falls, Montana – The following events will take place at the library in April.

Closure

The Great Falls Public Library will be closed on Sunday, March 31, in honor of Easter.

Art @ the Library

In April the library is hosting an exhibit by Seattle resident and Great Falls native Caitlin Mellinger. The exhibit will feature acrylic paintings and paper flower sculptures.

In April the library will also be hosting a photography exhibit by members of the Montana National Guard. This expo will include photos from around the world, covering Montana National Guard men and women at work. Through combined efforts of the Montana National Guard Public Affairs Office and the Holter Museum, this expo has evolved from what was meant to be a small presentation into a professional show. It has been on display in various venues around the state. It offers a unique view of the Montana National Guard through the eyes of professional photographers.

Foreign & Independent Film Series

The Great Falls Public Library continues its Foreign & Independent Film Series on Wednesday, April 3, 7:00 PM and Saturday, April 6, 2:00 PM, with the award-winning Spanish film *Amador*. The film tells the story of Marcela, a young immigrant with financial woes who finds a summer job looking after Amador, a bed-ridden, elderly man whose family is away. She thinks her problems are solved, but Amador dies shortly thereafter, putting Marcela in a predicament. His death will leave her jobless, something she can't afford to let happen. Faced with a moral dilemma, Marcela will prove that death can't always stop life. (Includes Adult Situations).

The selected short is *How It Ended*.

Films will be shown each month on the first Wednesday and the following Saturday. The series, which runs September through May, is free and open to the public. Be forewarned, some films may contain strong language or adult situations. They are not rated by MPAA but in our brochures we have tried to indicate content. Brochures are available at the library.

The OpenBooks Discussion Series, which runs October – May, continues on Thursday, April 4 at 7:00 pm, in the Montana Room of the library. April's selection is *Out Stealing Horses* by Per Petterson. In this quiet but compelling novel, Trond Sander, a widower nearing seventy, moves to a bare house in remote eastern Norway, seeking the life of quiet contemplation that he has always longed for. A chance encounter with a neighbor—the brother, as it happens, of his childhood friend Jon—causes him to ruminate on the summer of 1948, the last he spent with his adored father, who abandoned the family soon afterward. Trond's recollections center on a single afternoon, when he and Jon set out to take some horses from a nearby farm; what began as an exhilarating adventure ended abruptly and traumatically in an act of unexpected cruelty. Petterson's spare and deliberate prose has astonishing force, and the narrative gains further power from the artful interplay of Trond's childhood and adult perspectives. Loss is conveyed with all the intensity of a boy's perception, but acquires new resonance in the brooding consciousness of the older man.
