Great Falls, Montana – The following are events at the Great Falls Public Library during the month of October.

Art @ the Library in October

In October the Great Falls Public Library will host an exhibit featuring the work of the Studio 706 Artists' Guild. This exhibit will include paintings, drawings, photographs, and more. A reception for the artists will be held on Thursday, October 3, 5:00 – 7:00 p.m. This reception is free and open to the public.

Studio 706, a nonprofit artist's guild, was founded in 1997 to promote fine art, expose the community to local artists, teach and enrich local artists, and provide scholarships. The guild offers classes, mentoring, studio privileges, and exhibition opportunities to artists working in a variety of media. In addition it provides scholarships to Cascade County high school seniors planning to pursue art studies in college. In 2008, Studio 706 awarded \$1500 in college scholarships. This money is primarily raised from the Guild's art sales. Membership to the Guild is open at a nominal cost. For more information on the guild, call 452-5771.

October 2, at 7:00 pm. and Saturday, October 5, at 2:00 pm. This series is free and open to the public.

October's selection is the Italian and Mandarin film *Shun Li and the Poet*. When Shun Li, who works in a Roman textile factory to pay off the broker who brought her from China, is transferred to a small town to work as a bartender, she forms a close relationship with Bept. Bept is a Slav immigrant called "the Poet". Gossip threatens their innocent relationship, a bond that transcends two different, yet not all that distant cultures. (Italian and Mandarin with English subtitles) (The film does contain some adult situations.)

The featured short is *Shanghai Love Market*

Films will be shown each month on the first Wednesday and the following Saturday. The series, which runs September through May, is free and open to the public. Be forewarned, some films may contain strong language or adult situations. They are not rated by MPAA but in our brochures we have tried to indicate content. Brochures are available at the library.

OpenBooks Discussion Returns

The OpenBooks Discussion Series, which runs October – May, begins on Thursday, October 3, at 7:00 pm, in the Montana Room of the library. Discussions are held on the first Thursday of each month. These discussions, sponsored by Humanities Montana and the Great Falls Public Library Foundation, are free and open to the public. You may attend any and all of the discussions. Books are available at the library three weeks prior to each meeting. You will need a library card to check a book out whether you attend the discussion or just read the book. October's selection is *Blzac and the Little Chinese Seamstress* by Sijie Dai. *Balzac and the Little Chinese Seamstress* is an enchanting tale that captures the magic of reading and the wonder of romantic awakening. An immediate international bestseller, it tells the story of two hapless city boys exiled to a remote mountain village for re-education during China's infamous Cultural Revolution. There the two friends meet the daughter of the local tailor and discover a hidden stash of Western classics in Chinese translation. As they flirt with the seamstress and secretly devour these banned works, the two friends find transit from their grim surroundings to worlds they never imagined.

Financial Aid Seminar

Of the many productions the company has performed over the years, this is by far the most popular. It was adapted for the stage by Ron Fitzgerald, a former television writer and playwright.
