Summer Hours & Closures

The Great Falls Public Library announces the last Sunday of the season in which the library will be open is May 18. Following that day, the library will be on its summer schedule, closed on Sundays through September. Summer hours are:

Monday, Friday, & Saturday 10 am – 6 pm

Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday 10 am – 8 pm

The Great Falls Public Library will also be closed on Monday, May 26, in recognition of Memorial Day.

Art at the Library

The Great Falls Public Library continues to host Civil War 150: Exploring the War and Its Meaning through the Words of Those Who Lived It. This national traveling panel exhibit, sponsored by the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, will be at the library through June 16. This exhibit utilizes letters, personal accounts, and images to trace major events during the war through the eyes of soldiers, presidents, freemen, and families. Visitors can come to understand how people dealt with the end of slavery, the nature of democracy and citizenship, the human toll of war, and the role of the president in wartime.

As a companion to this exhibit, the library is also hosting a collection of Civil War photos, memorabilia, and stories from the personal collection of Ken Robison.

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As a contrast to the above historical exhibits, the library is also hosting an exhibit by local, eclectic artist Halley Gallagher. Halley is a Great Falls native who has been the artist in residence at both the Great Falls Public Schools and Paris Gibson Square. She has a Bachelor's degree in studio painting. Halley uses her work to explore patterns in nature and the world. She blends abstract and figurative art to create unique, colorful work.

Summer Reading

The Great Falls Public Library is proud to announce the beginning of their annual Adult Summer Reading program, which runs June 1 through August 7. Anyone 19 and older with a library card can participate in the adult summer reading program. Library cards are FREE to anyone who lives in Cascade County. To get a card, bring in picture ID and proof of address.

Participation is simple. Every time you check out materials at the library during this time period, put your checkout slip into the drawing box. Grand prize winners will be selected at the library's summer reading party on Thursday, August 7. The grand prize this year is an e-reader.

This program is co-sponsored by the Friends of the Great Falls Public Library.

Mark your calendar for the final summer reading party on Thursday, August 7 from 5 – 7 pm. This event will be free and open to the public. It will feature games and activities for children and adults, along with a dunk tank and magician. Returning to provide entertainment is the popular puppeteer duo Bat Honey. More party details will be available as the party approaches.

Civil War 150

The Great Falls Public Library continues the Civil War 150 programs commemorating the 150th anniversary of the Civil War through June 19. Those programs, which are free and open to the public, are listed below.

Thursday, June 5, 7:00 PM Lincoln and Liberty: Songs as Sound Clips with Bill Rossiter

The songs of the American Civil War provided a soundtrack for one of the most important periods in our history. Their messages, both the official songs and the sometimes-wicked parodies written by the troops, give us a glimpse of the period that we might miss if we study only battles and politics. Lincoln himself was often the subject—or target—of these songs, some which make today's political wrangling look downright polite. This presentation features clips from that soundtrack, accompanied by banjo, autoharp, and harmonica. Bill Rossiter is a retired instructor of literature and folklore and chair of the Humanities Division of the Flathead Community

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College.

Saturday, June 7, 10 AM – 4 PM *Bonnets and Battlefields: An Interactive Experience*

Re-enactors Tia Toby and Jim Vaughn will set up a small encampment in the Library Park that will provide an interactive experience for people. In case of bad weather, we will move to the Cordingley Room. They will have an assortment of items Clara Barton would have taken onto the battlefield, including her medicinal herbs, clothing, supplies, etc. Informational brochures will also be provided. They will also have black powder muzzleloading demonstrations. They will also offer formal presentations during the following times:

Documenting Montanans Civil War Experience

Rich Aarstad from the Montana State Historical Society will speak about the Montanans and the Civil War.

Thursday, June 19, 7:00 pm *We Fought in the Civil War—Yankees & Rebels Who Came to Montana Territory*

Dick Thoroughman brings to life “The South was right to fight” theme that was used by Confederate President Jefferson Davis in his 1882 tour of the South.

Ken Robison portrays Union Infantry Captain Joseph O. Gregg as he discusses his Civil War service and leadership in Great Falls in the Grand Army of the Republic that led to the creation of the Soldiers Plot and Soldiers Monument in Highland Cemetery.

Bob Harris portrays Union Infantry Sergeant Charles Meek, an African American who came to Montana after fighting in the war. He settled in Great Falls where he was a leader in the black community and in veterans and political affairs.

Page Forward

The new book discussion groups introduced by the Great Falls Public Library this year continue in June.

Page Forward Saturdays continues on Saturday, June 14 10, 10 am, and continues on the second Saturday of each month. This discussion group is unique in as much as each month’s discussion will be a celebration of the 100th anniversary of women’s suffrage in Montana and will focus on books written by and about Montana women.

June’s selection is *A Bride Goes West* by Nannie T. Alderson. Among hundreds of books written by and about range men, there are hardly a dozen valid ones concerning women *A Bride Goes* is one of the best books pertaining to ranch life by women with a woman's point of view dominating.

Page Forward Tuesdays continues on Tuesday, June 24, 7:00 pm, and continues on the fourth Tuesday of each month. June’s selection is *The Art of Fielding* by Chad Harbach. This highly acclaimed novel is about summer’s favorite pastime, baseball, ambition, friendship, family, love, and commitment to oneself and others. It’s a perfect summer read.

This event will continue on the third Thursday of each month.

Each month we will show three TED Talks videos featuring experts in their fields sharing cutting edge ideas, innovation, and progressive ways of applying expertise for the betterment of society. A lively discussion will follow.

In the spirit of ideas worth spreading, TEDx is a program of local, self-organized events that bring people together to share a TED-like experience. At a TEDx event, TED Talks video and live speakers combine to spark deep discussion and connection in a small group. These local, self-organized events are branded TEDx, where x = an independently organized TED event. The TED Conference provides general guidance for the TEDx program, but individual TEDx events are self-organized. (These events are subject to certain rules and regulations developed by TED.)

About TED

TED is a nonprofit organization devoted to Ideas Worth Spreading. Started as a four-day conference in California almost 30 years ago, TED has grown to support those world-changing ideas with multiple initiatives. The two annual TED Conferences invite the world's leading thinkers and doers to speak for 18 minutes on a diverse mixture of topics. Many of these talks are then made available, free, at TED.com.
